This checklist for transition provides **Best Practice** guidance for children and young people with social communication difficulties and/or Autism.

This will ensure consistency of approach which will lead to success for young people at this important milestone.

Transition Book	It is very important to thoroughly prepare autistic pupils for a change to a new class or school. One way of doing this is to make a photo transition book that they can look at or read at home and at school.  Gradual preparation can ensure a pupil is well prepared and familiar with their new environment before they start school.  Consider providing a transition booklet with key information at an appropriate level for the pupil's understanding. Include interviews with both members of staff and current pupils. It is also a great chance to show off what's best about a school and include any relevant information on how you support SEND pupils and notable achievements of current and former pupils.

Common transfer days	Each local authority has a set date on which all Year 6 children in the area spend the day at their new school. This tends to be in early July, before schools break up for the summer.  The common date means that all children in that area are able to attend their induction day, regardless of which primary school they attend or which secondary they'll be going to. Enhanced transition days	A child may need extra visits to their new classroom or area in school. Visits could include meeting with new staff (if possible) in their own classroom or area that is familiar with the child. The child would benefit from being given the opportunity to speak to new staff in informal environments such as the playground.
